## INSTRUCTIONS FOR RECORDING DATA AND PACKING SPECIMENS FOR SHIPMENT TO THE HERBARIUM FOR IDENTIFICATION

  - 1. Send the whole plant, if reasonably possible, rather than a small fragment.
  - 2. To keep specimens fresh during shipment by mail, they should be wrapped in moist paper towels or newspaper and placed in a plastic bag. Too much moisture should be avoided as this will cause mildew.
  - 3. The material will be examined more promptly, if it is mailed early in the week, thus avoiding the weekend delay in handling.
